The Board of Regents met in special meeting, pursuant to agreement, in the office of the Superintendent on Wednesday, May 29th, at 11 A. M., instead of on May 27th. Present: Messrs. Arthur L. Gaston, Chairman, F. H. Barnwell, A. W. Reynolds, J. E. Sirrine and B. R. Tillman.

The Minutes of the meeting of May 9th were read and corrected.
