Dr. Sol Brown McLendon was born in Marlboro County, South Carolina. After graduating from the Bennettesville High School he entered the Presbyterian College, Clinton, S. C., in 1921 and grad-

uated in 1925, receiving the Bachelor of Arts Degree.

The same year he entered the College of Charleston, S. C., for one year's pre-medical work.

His Medical Degree was received from the Medical College of South Carolina, Charleston, in 1930.

On July 1, 1930, he joined the medical staff of the South Carolina State Hospital and he has been connected with the hospital continuously since that time.

At present Dr. McLendon is Clinical Director of the State Park Division, and Acting Clinical Director of the Columbia Division.

He is a member of the Columbia Medical Society; the State and National Medical Associations; the Southeastern Society of Neurology and Psychiatry; a Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and a Diplomat of the American Board of Neurology and Psychiatry.
